WHAT TO WATCH FOR THIS WEEKEND:

CAN JPM PICK UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF?: Juan Pablo Montoya is still adapting to his return to Indy car racing, but a fourth-place finish at the streets of Long Beach shows the former champion doesn't have that much more rust to shake off. Montoya, the 2000 Indianapolis 500 winner, claimed his first NASCAR pole at Talladega. Can he achieve another Alabama milestone and get back to winner's circle this weekend?



CONWAY SEEKS BACK-TO-BACK WINS: Mike Conway was a surprise winner at Long Beach, inheriting the lead with three laps remaining and returning Ed Carpenter Racing to the winner's circle. Now, the Englishman looks for another milestone — helping the team win its first entrant championship. Can Conway win again and help the team stay near the top of the standings?

DIXON STARTS STRONG IN TITLE DEFENSE: Target Chip Ganassi Racing's Scott Dixon has shown he's a contender to repeat as Verizon IndyCar Series champion. The New Zealand native has finished second in the previous four races at Barber and came within a few laps of scoring a win at Long Beach. Can Dixon continue his strong start to 2014 and finally claim his first victory at Barber?
