WHAT TO WATCH FOR THIS WEEKEND:

TK EYES TRIPLE CROWN: Indy 500 winner Tony Kanaan will have more than a race win on his mind at Pocono Raceway. Should Kanaan win the race, he'll guarantee himself a \$250,000 bonus and remain eligible for a \$1 million bonus awarded by Fuzzy's Ultra Premium Vodka for winning at Indianapolis, Pocono and Auto Club Speedway. Al Unser is the only driver to have won all Triple Crown races (Indy, Pocono and Ontario) in the same calendar year, winning in 1978.



AMERICAN DRIVERS SEEK GLORY: The IZOD IndyCar Series features a group of home-grown stars who represent the stars and stripes in the most diverse series in motorsports.
