HELIO LOOKS TO LOCK UP TITLE: The IZOD IndyCar Series championship is anyone's to win with 13 drivers still with a mathematical chance to win the series title. Helio Castroneves took advantage of the misfortune of his championship rivals at Sonoma and has a 39-point advantage over Scott Dixon. Can Castroneves, who is the only driver to complete every lap of every race in 2013, keep the pressure on his rivals by securing his first win in Charm City?



INDYCAR IRONMAN: INDYCAR's ironman is a fitting moniker for Tony Kanaan. Not only is the Indianapolis 500 winner a triathlete who has competed in the famed Ironman triathlon, but Kanaan will break Jimmy Vasser's record for consecutive starts in Baltimore. Coincidentally, Cal Ripken broke Lou Gehrig's record at Camden Yards, which is part of the Baltimore Grand Prix circuit.
